U.S. citizens and eligible non-citizens are encouraged to file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). If you haven't completed the FAFSA, you may still do so at **fafsa.gov**. Please be sure to use school code E00505.

We're Here to Help

New Student Orientation

Prior to your first semester, you'll have the opportunity to meet fellow classmates, interact with upperclassmen and connect with St. Joseph's resources. The orientation experience does not end there, but continues with Welcome Week and throughout the fall semester with SJNY 100 for first-year students and SJNY 200 for transfer students.

First Year Experience - SJNY 100 Transfer Student Experience - SJNY 200

As a new student, you will take SJNY 100/SJNY 200 in conjunction with a seminar class. The First Year Experience (FYE) and Transfer Student Experience (TSE) is an extended orientation program to facilitate your transition to St. Joseph's University. Classes take place every Tuesday of your first semester during Common Hour (12:40-1:30 p.m.). This mandatory course introduces students to co-curricular learning by providing ways to get involved, discussing available college resources and creating an understanding of the mission and history of the University.

First Year Student Registration

Please look for a series of emails regarding first-year registration for the fall semester. You will meet one-on-one with a faculty or academic adviser to select and register for your courses. You will receive another email providing you with instructions to set up your St. Joseph's University Portal and email, confirm your intended major, as well as note your course preferences.

Transfer Registration

You will receive an email invitation to schedule your transfer registration appointment with a faculty adviser. You may also contact the Director of the Academic Advisement Center, Jane Carleo, at 631.687.1497 or jcarleo@sjny.edu.

Faculty Advisement

You will have an academic adviser at St. Joseph's University ready to help you. The success of our academic programs stems in large part from the interest of the faculty in the individual student. Opportunities are provided for new students to discuss their interests and majors with a faculty adviser before drawing up their programs. Faculty will guide you in selecting courses that best meet your needs.

The Academic Advisement Center is located on the third floor of O'Connor Hall. In addition to the faculty adviser assigned to each student, the Academic Advisement Center is staffed with professional academic advisers who help students with course planning, departmental requirements, and planning for educational and career goals. The center also offers assistance with understanding the core curriculum, selecting classes and registration, so that students are on schedule for graduation.

Experiential Learning and the Core Curriculum

Course offerings and activities in the common core and experiential learning areas include various options designed to connect purely academic coursework with practical experience. Students learn the value of service and experiential learning via interactive experiences and reflections within real-world contexts. These experiences encourage students to forge a link between theory and practice while clarifying their connections to the community, the liberal arts and a variety of professions.

Relevant Internships

St. Joseph's University assists students with internship opportunities that connect them with politicians in local offices and top companies. Our internship programs bring students into the workforce for real-time, hands-on experience and often lead to full-time positions upon completion. Office for Tutoring, Academic Development and Student Accessibility Services

Our Office for Tutoring, Academic Development and Student Accessibility Services provides individualized tutoring across every discipline and helps develop writing skills. The office also delivers training in college survival skills, such as time management, critical thinking and understanding assignments.

Honors Program

The Honors Program at St. Joseph's University is a community of scholars striving for the highest personal and academic goals. The program aims to provide motivated students with a wide range of experiences. Selected students will take courses with dynamic faculty, have the opportunity to go on field trips in the United States and abroad, and develop skills that will help them to excel in graduate school and succeed in their careers.

Office of Career Preparation and Professional Development

The Office of Career Preparation and Professional Development helps students identify personal and career goals, develop strategies for growth and achievement, target areas of interest and talent, and chart a customized career development plan. Help with career exploration and job and graduate school searches is also provided. Workshops are offered throughout the year on such topics as résumé development and interview skills. Students will find a wide variety of computerized, printed, audio and video materials in the career library. First-year are provided with a four-year development plan. Customized career plans can be tailored for transfer students, as well.

Center for Counseling and Wellness

Located at 319 West Roe Blvd., the office promotes student wellness by providing a range of services to address their personal, social, psychological and academic welfare. Our services include short-term individual therapy; group, walk-in and crisis counseling; and prevention and education programs and workshops. Students may seek help for a variety of reasons, such as stress stemming from academic or personal problems, anxiety, depression, loneliness, relationship and

family problems, grief, loss, trauma, abuse, alcohol or drug issues, and eating disorders. Sessions are confidential and available to all registered St. Joseph's students. Students can schedule an appointment to speak with a counselor by emailing liwellness@sjny.edu.

Health Services

Health Services support the basic health needs of all St. Joseph's University students, regardless of insurance coverage. The services communicate positive health behaviors and a healthy campus. Students can walk in to meet with a registered nurse to discuss their health concerns, including general physical assessments, informational counseling on nutrition, safe sex, public health issues, over-the-counter medication and NYS immunization requirements. The office also responds to crises and provides emergency first-aid.

The Office of Information Technology Services has established a thoughtful and effective integration of technology into the scholarly environment by providing the University community with the tools necessary to support and enrich academic endeavors and experiences. Several modern computer labs are available for student use throughout the campus. Follow Me print technology is available on personal and campus computers, giving you the flexibility to release your jobs at your convienence, at any of our print release stations. The



St. Joseph's University mobile app is available in the Google Play and iOS app stores to easily access your university information. Wireless access is provided

throughout the campus. All students receive a St. Joseph's University Student Portal account that is activated when registering for classes. The portal gives our students single sign-on access to the St. Joseph's Google Workspace, Canvas (learning management system), Student Self Service located in WebAdvisor (for viewing grades, academic planning, registration, paying bills and more), Zoom and many other St. Joseph's resources. Each classroom includes large-screen projection and whiteboard walls and a unified control system, as well as video, audio and internet capabilities. Several classrooms on campus have wireless laptops, desktops, iPads or SMART interactive displays. The campus also offers classes in our Telepresence Classrooms, where Brooklyn and Long Island connect through remote classrooms that are fully equipped with high-definition cameras, TVs, ceiling-mounted speakers and microphone systems for a state-of-the-art classroom experience. Our staff will help you make the most of the technology available to you.







Stay Informed

Does St. Joseph's award academic credit for AP exams?

Yes, St. Joseph's University awards credit for AP exams. A minimum score of 3 is required for most exams, but you can preview a full list of required scores on our website. To have your AP scores formally evaluated for credit, please make arrangements to have the College Board send your official score report to our University's Office of the Registrar. IB credits and CLEP exams may also be considered for credit and would require official documentation.

How can I have my college courses transferred to St. Joseph's?

If you have completed college courses through another institution, please make arrangements to have your final official transcript sent directly to the Long Island Campus Office of Admissions. For a preview of predetermined transfer credit, please visit our Online Transfer Evaluation System.

How will I know what classes to take?

Your adviser will develop a schedule based on your major and pre-selected course preferences.

When is orientation and what takes place during this program? Fall Orientation will take place on campus on August 28, 2024.

During this time, students will be welcomed into the St. Joseph's University community, hear from university leaders, learn about the resources we offer and meet their classmates. Orientation leaders will help you settle, introduce you to the University mission and detail on-campus activities.

Is orientation mandatory?

Yes. As a new student, it is important that you are introduced to the wealth of opportunities and services at St. Joseph's University so you can avail yourself of a full collegiate experience. During the summer, the Office of Student Life will send you a full program and information on orientation activities.

Does the University provide services for students with disabilities?

Yes. For information about receiving classroom accommodations, contact Student Accessibility Services in the Office for Tutoring, Academic Development and Student Accessibility Services, which coordinates services for students with disabilities. This office is located on the third floor of O'Connor Hall.

Does St. Joseph's offer health insurance?

St. Joseph's University does not provide health insurance. Students are required to show proof that they are enrolled in a health insurance plan or have coverage under their parents/family plan that offers coverage in New York state.

How do I get verification of my full-time enrollment at St. Joseph's University or my medical insurance?

Visit your MySJNY Student Portal, locate Student Services in the left margin and click on Registrar's Office. Here you will find information and instructions on how to obtain an Enrollment Verification/Certification through the National Student Clearinghouse.

What student organizations and activities can I join?

St. Joseph's University offers a wide array of student clubs, organizations, events and activities. Getting involved is a great way to meet new people, have fun, enhance your college experience and gain invaluable leadership, organizational and communication skills. Long Island students can participate in academic, art, Greek, multicultural, social, service and religious organizations on campus. They can also get involved in Student Government.

How do I get involved in student organization and activities?

There are student organizations for every interest and they are listed online at <u>SJNY Engage</u>, the virtual home of our organizations. Here, you can review details about student events held on campus, and learn about what our organizations have to offer. Students with particular interests are welcome to start a new group at any time. The campus hosts a Student Organization Fair each semester.

When must I declare a major?

Students must declare a major after earning 30 credits — usually at the beginning of their sophomore year. The University allows new students to explore various disciplines through the core curriculum before committing to focus on a single area. However, for some academic majors, students are encouraged to select their major earlier.

When will I receive my St. Joseph's University email account?


Students will receive an email with steps on how to set up your University email account and student portal. A student email address typically consists of the first initial of your name and your last name @student.sjny.edu, but in some cases it could include a number if you have a common last name. For example: Jane Smith would be jsmith2@student.sjny.edu. Your St. Joseph's Network ID will be provided to you via email with the steps for setting up your University email. 


